
APPLICATION QUESTIONS

Please find below a list of the questions you will be asked in the application process. Each question has some prompts to support you in thinking about your answers. If you wish to supplement your application, we would encourage applicants to submit a 90 second video to support their application, bring it to life and add in areas they feel are relevant which aren't directly asked about below. Please do this by sending a video in an MP4 format via WeTransfer to beth@englandfutsal.com by the deadline.

Some questions have word limits, please note that the recruitment panel will not read beyond these limits so please ensure your application sticks to the word count.

You cannot save your progress on your application in the portal, we recommend working on your answers elsewhere (e.g., a Word Document) and pasting them in when you come to submit your application.

In addition to the below questions, you will be asked some introduction questions (e.g., your name) to allow us to process your application.



Questions

In no more than 150 words, what experiences have you had to date that would make you a valuable commission member?

Prompts:

- What have you done or experienced that relates to the area of work of the Commission you are applying for?
- What have these experiences taught you? How can you share these learnings?
- How can your diversity of thought broaden our horizons & hold us to account?

In no more than 150 words, skills do you possess that would make you a valuable commission member?

Prompts:

- What skills (professionally or vocationally) do you bring that can help the Commission and futsal in England?
- How can your practical knowledge help shape the work that the group will do?
- How can you gather, assimilate & represent the views of your peers?

In no more than 150 words, why would you like to sit on your chosen Commission?

Prompts:

- What has excited you enough to spend the time completing this application?
- Why are you motivated to contribute to the journey with England Futsal?
- How will you constructively challenge England Futsal?
- Why work to champion this particular area?

In no more than 150 words, what personal behaviours & values drive you that would make you a valuable commission member?
